■ A consultation has taken place on plans to upgrade White Rose Lane Nature Reserve. The plans include a boardwalk, allowing easier pedestrian access to White Rose Lane.

"I personally pushed for these plans to go out to consultation, and I'm pleased they have," said Mark. "The boardwalk is crucial for local people who need a safer walking route.

"The plans will also enhance the environment, reduce flooding and ensure more people can share in the wonderful things the nature reserve has to offer."

PAVEMENTS ARE FOR PEOPLE, SAYS DAVID

■ Mark and David are launching a campaign to keep local pavements clear of unnecessary clutter—something that would make life easier for pedestrians, including the elderly and parents with children. Residents with pavement problems are urged to get in touch.

“Right across Mount Hermon, there are too many instances of footpaths and verges being

obstructed by cars, bushes and bins,” said Mark. “We want to foster more respect for ordinary people, particularly the elderly, the disabled and mothers with prams, who need to use them every day free from hindrance.”

“Untidy pavements are ugly and inconvenient for those who have to deal with them,” said David. “Our message is clear: pavements are for people—not bushes, cars or wheelie bins.”

RAISING THE STANDARD OF WOKING'S STREETS

■ Mark has been busy responding to residents' concerns on roads, notably where footpaths have fallen below the required standard.

“Cracked and poorly maintained footpaths make it difficult for people to walk, particularly those who are elderly or infirm,” said Mark. “While Woking Borough Council is not directly responsible for most footways, I've achieved results for residents in terms of getting them repaired.”

Just recently, Surrey County Council has had to take remedial action on roads including Dorset Drive, Heathside Crescent, Oriental Road and Park Road due to pressure from Mark.
